

An innovative new way of repairing Shropshire's potholes more quickly, quietly and effectively is to be rolled out across the county following a successful trial in Whitchurch and Market Drayton. The work – which will be carried out on urban roads – will be carried out overnight, helping to minimise disruption. Its focus is to repair a large number of potholes, and it's anticipated that up to 40 could be repaired each night – the current rate is around 20 per week. See link for more info.


In the next two months we'll be surface dressing almost 40 stretches of road across the county as part of our annual road maintenance programme. Surface dressing is a quick, efficient and cost-effective way of maintaining skid-resistance and waterproofing road surfaces, and plays an important part in preventing potholes forming on the county's roads.
