

Step 1: Find the location of the works you wish to check using Table XX (maybe add link)

You can find a location by entering a street name, parish, ward, district or local authority in the Where do you want to go? box. You can also search by USRN or works reference number.

Step 2: Copy the USRN for that specific Scheme and past into **Search Locations** , ref [1] below. You can also use Long/Lat should you have this to hand.

Search and Date options



- 1** Search locations, Streets, Works Refs*, USRNs*, Plan IDs*, Long/Lat
- 2** Today, Next two weeks, Next three months*, Next twelve months* date ranges
- 3** Calendar date picker* to search a specific date range
- 4** Geolocation allows the map to locate your current position

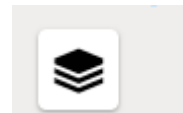

Step 3: Click on the “Today” button, ref [2] above for a drop down. Select suitable date range.

Step 4: Ensure the correct layers are on by clicking the Icon at the top left corner of the interactive map.

Click on the arrow to the right of each tab to see which layers within can be activated or deactivated.




A layer is activated when there is a tick in the box. Some layers are only visible at certain levels of zoom.



Step 5: To find planned road closures and diversions that affect the area in question, please click on and select:

“Toggle all” for Road closures and diversions & Traffic Restrictions

Select “Road Works” under High Impact .

Step 6: Zoom in and click on the line for the location in question.

Road closures and diversions layers will present as lines along affected roads, accompanied by icons.

Lines are only visible at certain levels of zoom, depending on their length. Clicking on these lines or icons will reveal detailed information about the closures and diversions, such as times in force,

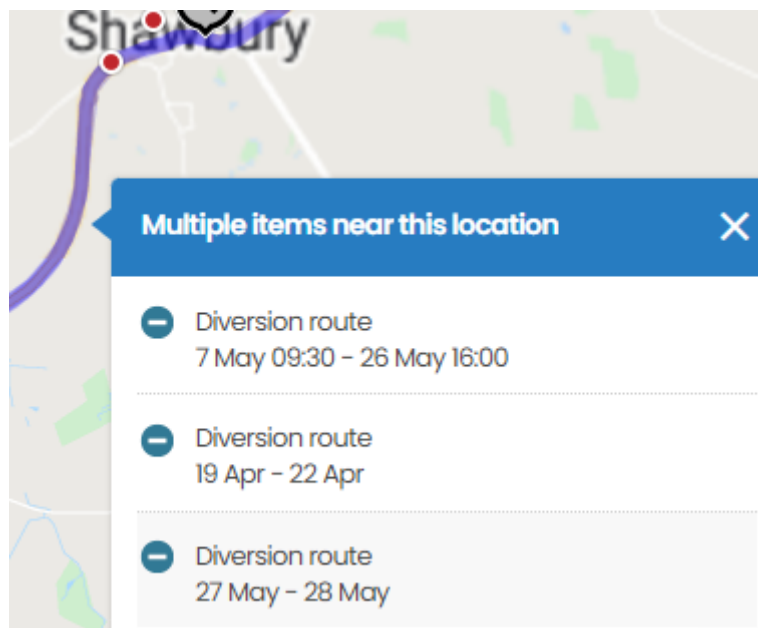
a description of the disruption, diversion directions, and attached documents (see below for more information on what the icons mean).

Important Map Icons



- Incidents happening on the network
- Highway Authority promoted works. Icons are coloured by expected level of impact. Red for Delays likely, amber for delays possible, green for Delays unlikely.
- Statutory undertakers categorised into the type of Utility works , including Highways England and rail works.
- Non Streetworks Activities (NSAs) including Skips and Scaffolding.
- Closure information provided by Subscribers to Traffic Management
- Diversion and other Traffic intervention information provided by Subscribers
- Closures and Bridge Closures managed in Real-time by Subscribers to Live Link
- Events
- Planned works by unsubscribing Highway Authorities

Step 7: Clicking onto the line will present any planned works that affect this route (see below).



By clicking into an entry as shown above, this will bring up a prompt box that will provide detailed information such as:

- **Originator:** The organisation that has put the permit in place will have their logo at the very top.
- **Dates:** Please note that there are occasions (particularly for weather dependent work programmes such as surface dressing) where a broad date range is initially indicated.

Further detail on planned closure dates/times is available by clicking on the



road works icon.

- **Description:** Details on the nature of the work
- **Route Description:** If there is a planned diversion in place, this will be detailed in this section.
