2011 Census: Year of Arrival of Shropshire Residents who were Born Outside of the United Kingdom

Interpretation of Year of Arrival Data

According to the 2011 Census, 14,387 residents of Shropshire were born outside of the United Kingdom (4.7% of the total usual resident population of the county). In the Census questionnaire, residents who stated that their country of birth was not in the United Kingdom were then asked when they most recently arrived to live in the UK.

The following table focusses on residents who said that they arrived in the UK between 2001-2011. This information can be used alongside statistics on passports held to give an indication of different communities in Shropshire.

Looking further at the information provided for residents who arrived in the UK between 2001-2011, it is possible to analyse these residents by their region or country of birth. The following table shows the number of residents that arrived in the UK by country of birth and is ordered to reflect the proportion that these residents made of the overall total residents of Shropshire born in those countries.

The countries of birth in Table 2 are not necessarily those with the largest numbers of residents in Shropshire, although only categories with more than 100 residents are shown. Table 2 takes into consideration the overall number of residents born in countries outside of the UK and the proportion of these residents who arrived within the decade prior to the 2011 Census.

Passports Held

The 2011 Census collected information from residents on whether they held at least one passport. The following table analyses the proportion of people holding a passport who were born outside of the UK and arrived between 2001-2011. It should be noted that, of those residents who arrived between 2001-2011, 1,322 people held a UK passport and 240 people held no passport.

Only categories with more than 100 residents are shown.
