Indices of Deprivation 2015 for Lower Super Output Areas in Shropshire: Income Deprivation Domain

About the Indices of Deprivation


The English Indices of Deprivation 2015 [IMD 2015] data is provided by the Department for Communities and Local Government (© Crown Copyright 2016). It provides an indication of deprivation at Lower Super Output Area [LSOA] level, a small area statistical geography.

The Income Deprivation Domain is one of several domains which focus on a particular type of deprivation. The scores from this domain contribute 22.5% towards the overall IMD 2015, the joint highest percentage alongside the Employment Deprivation Domain.

For the Income Deprivation Domain, all of the 32,844 LSOAs in England have been given a national ranking, with 1 being the most deprived LSOA. The LSOAs have also been divided, based on their rankings, into ten groups or Deciles with Decile 1 containing the 10% most deprived LSOAs in England.

Shropshire's LSOAs

Shropshire Unitary Authority has 193 LSOAs which are spread across all ten of the national Deciles, with 31.6% of LSOAs belonging to Deciles 1 to 5. As the following graph shows, twelve LSOAs fall within the 20% most deprived LSOAs for this domain in England.



LSOAs within the Council Areas

Shropshire Unitary Authority can be divided into three areas (North, Central and South). Whilst each area contains a similar number of LSOAs (68 in North, 61 in Central and 64 in South) and all areas have LSOAs falling within a wide range of Deciles, the North Area has the largest number of LSOAs in the most income deprived 50% of LSOAs nationally.

Indices of Deprivation 2015 for Lower Super Output Areas in Shropshire: Income Deprivation Domain





Most Income Deprived LSOAs in Shropshire

- Looking at the top ten most deprived LSOAs in Shropshire for the Income Deprivation Domain, the LSOAs are mainly located within Shropshire's main towns, including five LSOAs in Shrewsbury and two LSOAs in Oswestry (a third Oswestry LSOA is ranked 11th in Shropshire for this domain).
- The two LSOAs in Shropshire within national Decile 1 are both located in Shrewsbury, within Harlescott Electoral Division (ranked 1,243 in England, making it one of the 5% most deprived LSOAs for this domain) and Monkmoor Electoral Division (ranked 2,932 in England).

Supplementary Indices

IMD 2015 has two supplementary indices called the Income Deprivation Affecting Children Index [IDACI] and the Income Deprivation Affecting Older People Index [IDAOPI]. In Shropshire a larger number of IDAOPI LSOAs are classified as more deprived (65 LSOAs within the 50% most deprived nationally) compared to the IDACI (55 LSOAs within the 50% most deprived nationally). However, the top two IDACI LSOAs, within Shrewsbury and Ludlow, are ranked within the top 5% most deprived nationally.
