

Dangerous Wild Animals Act 1976 CONDITIONS

- 1. The licensee, or some responsible person **nominated by them in writing** shall take all reasonable precaution for the safety of the public and shall retain control over all portions of the premises.
- 2. The licensee shall maintain good order in and around the premises.
- The premises shall be maintained in good repair and decorative order. If required by the Council, a certificate by a qualified person as to the safe condition of all electrical wiring, fittings, equipment etc. must be made available.
- 4. The means of escape in the event of fire shall be to the satisfaction of the Fire Authority. Suitable first aid and fire fighting equipment shall be provided and sited in the positions detailed by the Chief Fire Officer. The equipment shall be maintained in efficient working order.
- 5. No alteration may be made to the premises without the approval of the Licensing Authority.
- 6. The species maintained on the premises shall be in accordance with those specified in the form of application and present as at the date the premises were inspected by the Veterinary Officer nominated by the Local Authority.
- 7. The licensee shall maintain a satisfactory insurance policy relating to damage or injury caused by animals and public liability generally.
- 8. The licensee shall at all times comply with any reasonable request of any Authorised Officer under the provisions of the Dangerous Wild Animals Act 1976.
- 9. The Council may impose such other conditions as are deemed necessary from time to time.
