Market Town Profile

Craven Arms

Craven Arms is a small market town situated in the South Shropshire hills on the A49. It is located south of Church Stretton and north of Ludlow. Craven Arms developed as a small rural settlement and is a relatively new town (for Shropshire), being only a small village "Newton" on a map of 1695. The arrival of the railway line led to the growth of the town in the 19th century. The Craven Arms Hotel which is located at the Junction of the A49 and B4368 was built around 1800 to provide accommodation to travellers. As the town grew it adopted the name of the hotel for the town.



Local Politics

Craven Arms is represented by a local town council that is responsible for the management of a range of services including; provision of grants to support local services and groups, some street lighting, grounds maintenance, bus shelter, Christmas lights.

Craven Arms Town Council is represented by 11 members.

Craven Arms is the seventeenth largest town in Shropshire by population. The latest population of Craven Arms is 3,000 (Mid Year Population Estimates, ONS, 2015) covering 3,127 hectares. Craven Arms population density was 0.9 people per hectare, making it the seventeenth most densely populated of all Shropshire Market Towns. Craven Arm's population consists of 51% male and 49 % female. Craven Arms Town Council population has increased since 1981 from 1,368 to 2,595. This is an increase of 90% in 30 years. (note Town Council boundaries can change over time causing changes in population).


Note: the population, dwellings and household figures are based on a smaller area than the parish council area. Population forecasts are based on developments of new housing.

The population of Craven Arms area is forecast to rise from 2,600, in 2011 to 3,600 in 2026. This is a rise of 38% over this period. The largest part of this increase is expected between 2011 and 2026, when the population is forecast to rise by around 1,000 people or 38%.

The number of dwellings is also forecast to increase from 1,200 in 2011 to 1,700 in 2026. This is an increase of 38%. Similarly the largest part of this growth is forecast to happen between 2011 and 2016.

The number of households are forecast to increase by 38% between 2011 and 2026, in a similar manner to dwellings.


Population by Local Areas

Age Structure

- Craven Arms has a slightly younger population profile to Shropshire
- There are a greater number of children aged 0-4 and 5-9 compared to Shropshire.
- Craven Arms has fewer people aged between 10 and 24 years compared to Shropshire.
- There were a greater proportion of people aged 25-29 and 35-39 compared to Shropshire, these levels were similar to English averages.
- There were lower amounts of the population between age 40 and 79 with the exception of the 60-64 age group which had levels higher than Shropshire.
- Craven Arms had a greater proportion of older people aged 80 plus.


1,700 Craven Arms residents are of traditional working age (16-64) which is the equivalent of 57.2% of the population. This compares with 58.9% for Shropshire as a whole, 61.7% in the West Midlands and 62.5% in Great Britain.

Ethnicity and Religion

The total BME (black minority ethnic group) in Craven Arms was 2.8% or 80 of the total population at the time of the 2011 Census. The largest group was Asian/Asian British, 1.7%, this is the highest percentage in all Shropshire towns for this group. Ethnicity levels in Craven Arms are higher than Shropshire but significantly lower than England.



2011. 72% of the Craven Arms population affiliated themselves with a religion. This percentage is marginally higher than for Shropshire or England. As is the case county-wide and nationally, the vast majority classified their religion as Christian (69.6% of the population or 96.0% of those expressing any religious affiliation). People classifying themselves as Muslim is relatively high in Craven Arms at 1.4% this is greater than in any other Shropshire town and greater than Shropshire as a whole 0.3%. There were also slightly higher levels of Hindu and Sikh, 0.2% compared to 0.1% for Shropshire. There were also more people classed as other religion.

Ethnicity



The latest ethnicity data is taken from the 2011 census. The next census is due in 2021 with the results likely to be published from 2023. To help provide an indication of changes to ethnicity data the number National Insurance registrations to adult overseas nationals entering the UK are shown. These numbers should only be used as an indication of population changes. A registration does not mean that a national has made permanent residence or has remained in the area.

The numbers shown are based on Middle Layer Super Output Areas. These areas are larger than the lower layers described in the population map.

There is one middle layer that covers Craven Arms. These layers do extend further than the 2 lower level layers that cover the town and extends to also cover the rural areas of Bromfield, Bitterley, Holdgate and Silvington.

Where registrations are less than 5, from any nation, the numbers are withheld to prevent identification of individuals. Therefore small numbers of other nationalities will have made registrations. The total number of overseas NI registrations from 2011/12—2019/20 in Craven Arms and surrounds was 322.

The majority of NI registrations from this period has been from 70 Hungarian and 108 Romanian nationals.

Ethnicity and Religion


Craven Arms is home to a number of churches and chapels which reflect the majority of the population who have a Christian faith.

- Living environment deprivation


There is one area of deprivation in Craven Arms which falls into the 30% most deprived deciles nationally. This area falls into Church Stretton and Craven Arms Electoral Division. The other LLSOA falls into the 5th decile.

Economy

Craven Arms is the equal eleventh largest employment centre in Shropshire (alongside Albrighton) and is one of the main locations of businesses and jobs in the south of the County, albeit notably smaller than Ludlow and slightly smaller than Church Stretton. Just 90 businesses have registered offices in Craven Arms (Source: FAME (Bureau van Dijk), February 2021) which is less than 1% of the Shropshire total and approximately 1,300 people are employed in the town (1.0% of the Shropshire total).



Over the last nine years, the number of jobs in Craven Arms has risen by 25.0%, or by some 250 jobs, which is the equivalent of an average increase of 28 jobs per annum. In comparison, the number of jobs in Shropshire rose by 8.3% over the same period while national growth stood at 13.2%. Craven Arms has been the fastest growing employment centre in Shropshire since 2010 (along with Albrighton).


In addition, there are a small number of business proprietors/sole traders based in the town.

Breakdown Part/Full Time

Part-time employment is more common in Shropshire than it is regionally or nationally, as illustrated in the chart opposite. The split between part-time and full-time employment in Craven Arms is in line with the Shropshire average.



Public/Private Sector

Across Shropshire, the number of public sector jobs has fallen by 4,700 since 2010 (-18.2%) while the number of private sector jobs has risen by 17,800 (+20.9%). The share of all the jobs attributable to the public sector has declined from 23.3% in 2010 to 17.1% by 2019. Employment in the public sector has been largely stable since 2015, with the rapid decline in public service based employment occurring during the first half of the 2010's.

In Craven Arms, public sector jobs account for 12.0% of all employment, notably less than the Shropshire average. Public sector employment has fallen by more than a fifth in the town since 2015 (-20.8%) while the number of private sector jobs has risen by +3.0%.



Employment Sectors

The four largest employment sectors in Craven Arms are property, manufacturing, accommodation & food services and health. Together these account for 52.4% of employment within the town. Employment in property is particularly strong, at 14.2% compared with less than 2% for Shropshire as a whole. 8% of all property employment across Shropshire is located in Craven Arms. Employment in manufacturing accounts for 21.7% of the total – again much higher than is the case for Shropshire (9.9%). 8.7% of jobs are in accommodation & food services (9.9% for Shropshire). Health accounts for 7.9% of jobs. Other sectors accounting for more than 5% of jobs include transport & storage, professional, scientific & technical, education and arts, entertainment and leisure.


The adjacent table shows the breakdown of employment sectors in Craven Arms alongside the comparable breakdowns for Shropshire, the West Midlands and for Great Britain.

It shows that agriculture, mining & quarrying, construction, motor trades, wholesale, retail, information & communication, finance & insurance, business administration & support and public administration and defence employ relatively few people in Craven Arms (21.7% of the total), with none of these sectors accounting for as much as 5% of total employment.

The chart on the following page shows the relative importance of each sector in Craven Arms according to its location quotient. This measures each sector in relation to the Shropshire average, with any score over 1 reflecting a sector that is more important than the Shropshire average, and any score under 1 reflecting a sector that has less importance.

Craven Arms supports a very large concentration of employment in property, which has a location quotient of 7.5. Other sectors that are over-represented include manufacturing, transport & storage and information & communication.






Business Rates

143 establishments have a rateable value in Craven Arms and the combined rateable value of these organisations is £2.8 million. This is the equivalent of 1.2% of the total rateable value of all businesses in Shropshire.

104 businesses have a rateable value of less than £12,000, which means that they are eligible for 100% small business rate relief. Just 6 (4.2%) have a rateable value of more than £51,000.

59 businesses have a floor space of less than 100m², while just 14 have floor space of more than 1,000m². The largest organisation covers more









The majority of organisations on the Craven Arms business rates list are classed as commercial—primarily retail outlets and offices. These account for 71.3% of the total. Industrial is the second largest classification, accounting for 16.8% of the total.

Economic Activity

The status of Craven Arms residents aged 16-64 at the time of the 2011 Census showed 79.7% of residents were economically active, which includes people who are both employed and actively seeking employment. This is very slightly lower than the Shropshire figure of 80.1%. Economic activity in Craven Arms is significantly higher than the national and regional averages (77% and 75.8% respectively).

Of those who were economically active, 75.5% were in employment while 4.2% were unemployed. This compares with 75.8% and 4.3% for Shropshire as a whole and with 71.2% and 5.8% for England. At the time of the Census, therefore, unemployment less significant than in England and on a par with the Shropshire average.

Of the 1,306 Wem residents in employment, the majority are employees (81.3%) while the remainder are self-employed. 70.0% of employees work full –time compared with 77.0% of the self-employed.


Self-employment is notably higher in Shropshire than it is nationally, accounting for 13.5% of 16-64 year old residents (10.5% in England). Typically, levels of self-employment are lower in the County's market towns, especially the main employment centres. However, in Craven Arms the self-employment rate at the time of the Census stood at 14.1% - slightly higher than the Shropshire average.

Economic Inactivity

352 Craven Arms residents aged 16-64 were economically inactive in 2011, which represents over a fifth of the age cohort. These people – representing those who are neither working nor seeking employment – include those who are retired, full time students, those looking after family or the long term sick. The proportion of the Craven Arms population which does not participate in the labour market is on a par with the average for Shropshire.

The following chart shows the breakdown of the economically inactive population in Craven Arms, Shropshire, the West Midlands and England according to the reason why they do not participate in the labour market. These figures relate to the 16-74 population rather than to 16 to 64 year olds.


It is apparent that a lower proportion of economically inactive Craven Arms residents are inactive because they are retired than is the case across Shropshire. The proportion of retired people remains high compared with the West Midlands and England, however. In comparison with Shropshire, more people of inactive due to a long-term illness or disability or because they are looking after a family.

Employment by Occupation

Craven Arms supports relatively low numbers working in the Standard Occupational Classifications (SOC) 1 to 3 the , with 27.5% of residents in work employed as managers, directors and senior officials, in professional occupations or in associate professional and technical occupations compared with 38.9% in Shropshire. 10.3% work as managers, 8.3% in professional occupations and 8.9% in associate professional occupations. A higher proportion are employed in lower level occupations, including elementary occupations (13.9% compared with 11.3% for Shropshire) and process, plant and machine operatives (10.5% compared with 7.4% for Shropshire). A very high proportion are employed in skilled trades occupations (20.7% compared with 12.2% for Shropshire).

Qualifications

According to the Census 2011, 21.2% of residents had a level 4 qualification or above, notably lower than the Shropshire average of 29.4%. In total 18% of people had no qualification. This is higher than the Shropshire average (14.0%). The qualification profile of Craven Arms residents reflects the type of employment that is prevalent amongst the working population, with fewer working in managerial or professional occupations and more in elementary occupations.



Unemployment

The claimant count is the main measure of people who are under pensionable age who are available for and actively seeking work and who are claiming out-of-work benefits (mostly Universal Credit but also Jobseekers Allowance). The chart below shows the number claiming this benefit in Craven Arms between December 2013 and December 2020.

Universal Credit

The following table shows the number of people claiming Universal Credit in Craven Arms in January 2021. It includes those who are out-of-work (and hence on the claimant count shown above), and also those who are on low incomes and entitled to in work benefits. The table also shows the number of households on universal credit in the town.

In December 2020, 90 Cleobury Mortimer residents were on the claimant count, which is more than four times higher than the 20 who were on the count in December 2017. The claimant rate in Craven Arms (the percentage of the 16-64 population which is claiming) is higher than the average for Shropshire (5.3% compared with 4.4%). This rate is lower than for either Great Britain (6.2%) or the West Midlands (7.2%). Claimant numbers everywhere were elevated throughout 2020 due to the coronavirus pandemic.


State Pension

In Shropshire there were 75,688, people claiming state pension in August 2020. This is slightly lower than 76,250 in February 2017, which is attributed to changes in retirement age.

Claimants in Craven Arms total 710 or 0.9% of the state pension claimants in the county.

Travel and Commuting

The most commonly used method of transport to work for Craven Arms residents who work was to travel by car or van. 41% of workers drove to work, while an additional 5% were a passenger in a car or van. A higher proportion of Craven Arms residents work primarily from home than is the case nationally at 5% (3% nationally) although this is lower than the Shropshire average of 6%. A relatively high number walk to work (13% compared with 9% for Shropshire and 7% for England). There were considerably fewer people travelling by public transport than is the case nationally. This is a pattern familiar to many rural areas



Car or Van Availability

Car ownership is high in Shropshire, which is typical of a rural area. Just 15.8% of households in the County do not have a car or van compared with a 25.8% of households nationally according to the 2011 Census. The proportion of households without a car in Craven Arms stands at 18.6%.

45.3% of households have one car, 25.9% have two cars while 10.2% have three or more. The total number of cars and vans owned by Craven Arms households stood at 1,697 in 2011.



Commuting Patterns

Craven Arms (place plan area) supports a lower level of employment self-containment than the largest market towns in Shropshire. Relatively close proximity to Ludlow means that the town's residents have reasonably easy access to the county's main employment centre in the south of the county. 31.7% of all Craven Arms jobs are filled by Craven Arms residents while 27.0% of working people who live in Craven Arms also work there, which gives an overall level of self-containment of 29.1%. The differential between the number of resident workers and the number of jobs is relatively small, with net out-commuting across the Craven Arms place plan border standing at 337. This equates with 1,656 people living in Craven Arms but working elsewhere and 1,319 people working in Craven Arms but living elsewhere.

Job density in Craven Arms is just below the county average with 0.85 jobs per resident worker compared with 0.95 in Shropshire. As illustrated in the chart below, the only towns where the number of jobs exceeds the resident workforce are Albrighton, Ellesmere, Ludlow and Shrewsbury.

Origins and Destination of Workforce

Other than Craven Arms, the rest of Shropshire is the main source of workers for Craven Arms jobs. Small numbers commute in from Herefordshire, Telford and Wrekin, Wrexham and Powys. Likewise, a significant proportion of Craven Arms resident workers who are not employed in Craven Arms work elsewhere in Shropshire.

Household income table for Shropshire shows that 17% or 390 households in Craven Arms earn less than £15,000 per year. At the other end of the scale 10% of households had an income exceeding £80,000 per annum. Household income rates in Craven Arms are lower than the Shropshire average.

Retail Economy

Retail accounts for 3.9% of total employment in Craven Arms, which is exceptionally low. 0.4% of all retail employment across the whole of Shropshire is absorbed by Craven Arms.

Retail plays an important role in the economy of Craven Arms. Providing everyday amenities and shopping for local residents



Tourism & Leisure

Approximately 200 people are employed in the tourism sector in Craven Arms, of which 61% are employed in accommodation and food services and the remainder in arts, entertainment, recreation and other services. This is the equivalent of 14.2% of the total Craven Arms workforce which represents a slightly lower share than for Shropshire as a whole (14.7%). 1.0% of total employment in the tourism sector in Shropshire is provided by Craven Arms.

Craven Arms is a visitor destination, being home or near to a number of attractions, and being central for visitors to the area of outstanding natural beauty. It describes itself as the "Gateway to the Marches". Surrounded by hills, Craven Arms is a good starting point for many long distance and shorter circular walks.



Health

Residents of Shropshire generally enjoy better health than across England as a whole with a healthy life expectancy being higher than average. Life expectancy in Shropshire is also higher than the national average. Life expectancy for births in Shropshire between 2016- 18 are 80.5 for males and 83.5 for females. This compares to an average of 79.3 and 82.9 for England. Despite this there are areas in Shropshire where health inequalities may exist. The index of deprivation, shown on the following map, highlight the areas where there are higher degrees of deprivation. The life expectancy variation between the least and most deprived health areas in Shropshire is equivalent to 4.2 years for men and 3.3 for women.



This domain measures the following:

- Years of potential life lost
- Comparative illness and disability ratio
- Acute morbidity
- Mood and anxiety disorders

In Craven Arms one areas fall into decile 3 or the 30% most deprived LLSOA's in England, and one area falls into decile 8, the 80% most deprived decile in England.

266 reported that their day-to-day activities were limited a lot


343 reported that their day-to-day activities were limited a little

The rate of people expressing that their day-to-day activities were limited a lot was 9.2% which is higher than the rate for Shropshire 8.4% and England 8.3%.

Health Conditions

At the time of the 2011 Census, 79% of residents in Craven Arms said that they felt they were in very good or good health. This was similar to the Shropshire and England average of 81%. In contrast 4.8% of people said their health was bad and 1.1% said their health was very bad.

Health Economy

Approximately 100 people are employed in the health sector in Craven Arms (8.4% of total employment) which is low compared with the Shropshire average of 14.7%. Notwithstanding this, it is the third largest employment sector in the town.



Housing

A lower number of Craven Arms household spaces were detached properties (32.7%) compared to Shropshire as a whole (39.5%). This was the largest housing type in the town.


Semi-detached houses are the largest housing type in Craven Arms, accounting for 34% of all houses similar to Shropshire with 33.4%.

There were a greater proportion of household spaces which were flat, maisonette, or apartment in a commercial building, (2.7%) compared to Shropshire (1.1%).

There were a greater number of terrace housing compared to Shropshire as a whole, 21.4% compared to 16.8% for Shropshire.

Housing Composition

- 30.5% of households were One Person Households greater than the Shropshire average (28.9%) and similar to the England (30.2%).
- 6.0% of households were Lone Parent with dependent children higher than the Shropshire average (5.2%) and lower than England (7.1%).
- 14.9% of households were One Person Pensioner aged 65 and over, greater than the Shropshire average of (13.9%) and England (12.4%).
- 13.6% of households were married couples with dependent children less than the Shropshire average of (15.3) and England (15.3).



In Craven Arms, at the time of the 2011 Census, there were 1,284 households, 1,353 dwellings and 4 Communal Establishments housing 6 people. The largest proportion (34.7%) of houses in Craven Arms were owned outright, similar to the Shropshire figure of 39%. 21.3% of households were social rented housing, this was greater than for Shropshire as a whole (13.5%) and greater than England (17.7%).

There were slightly more houses privately rented 16.9% compared to 15% for Shropshire and 14% for England. In Craven Arms there are 241 registered social landlord (RSL) homes. These homes are owned by a range of RSL's.

The table shows affordability ratios for housing in Shropshire. The income data relates to Shropshire Place Plan areas which are a slightly broader geography than market towns, and take account of hinterlands. The table shows that in Craven Arms a household with a median household income of (£26,872) would need 6.5 times this income to afford a median priced house (£175,000) as of year end 2020. This is lower than a ratio of 6.7 for Shropshire.

Housing Developments



Craven Arms is a key local educational centre for the town and surrounding areas. Pupils are mainly drawn from the Craven Arms Town area but schools also attracts pupils from the surrounding hinterland areas.

The town council area has one primary schools and nearby rural primary schools. The nearest secondary school is in Church Stretton.

The percentage of children living in the town parish area who are eligible for free school meals is 15%. This is higher than the rate for Shropshire which is 10.74%.

The percentage of children who have English as an additional language is 7.3%. This is higher than the rate in Shropshire where the overall rate is 4.64%

Craven Arms provides a primary schools to meet local needs. The nearest secondary schools are based in Ludlow (7 miles) and Church Stretton (9 miles). There is one primary school within the town centre area and two primary schools on the outskirts of the town.



Broadband

Digital connectivity is viewed as an increasingly important factor for business success, and nowadays broadband speed is a vital consideration when businesses are looking to relocate.

Superfast broadband is being rolled out across Shropshire, and nearly all premises in Craven Arms have access, or will have access within the next two years, to infrastructure that allows downloads speeds of at least 30 Mbps. Just 6 premises (0.4% of the total) are expected to have speeds that fall below this threshold. Nearly all premises in Craven Arms (and throughout most of Shropshire) are supplied by just one infrastructure provider.


