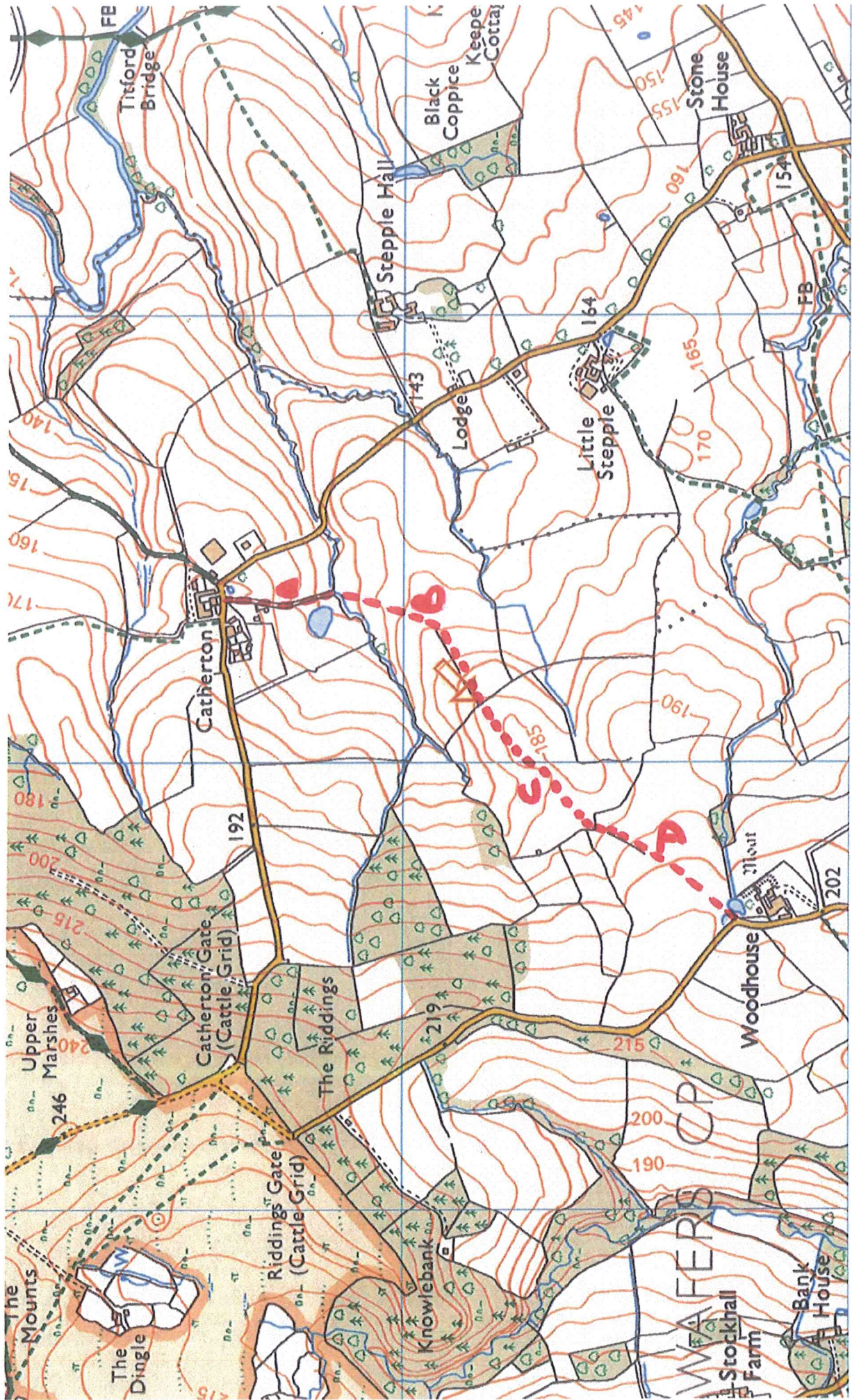

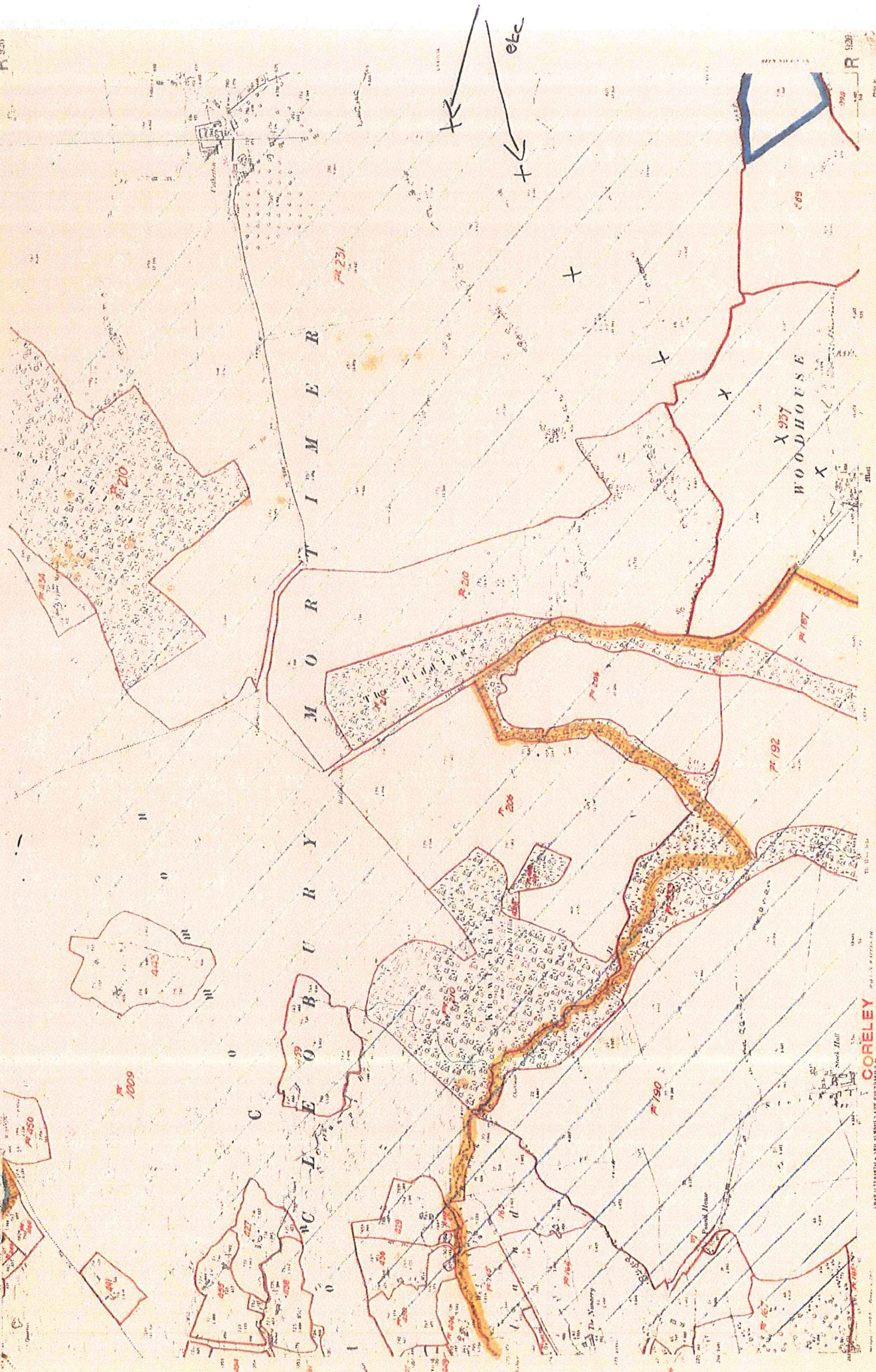

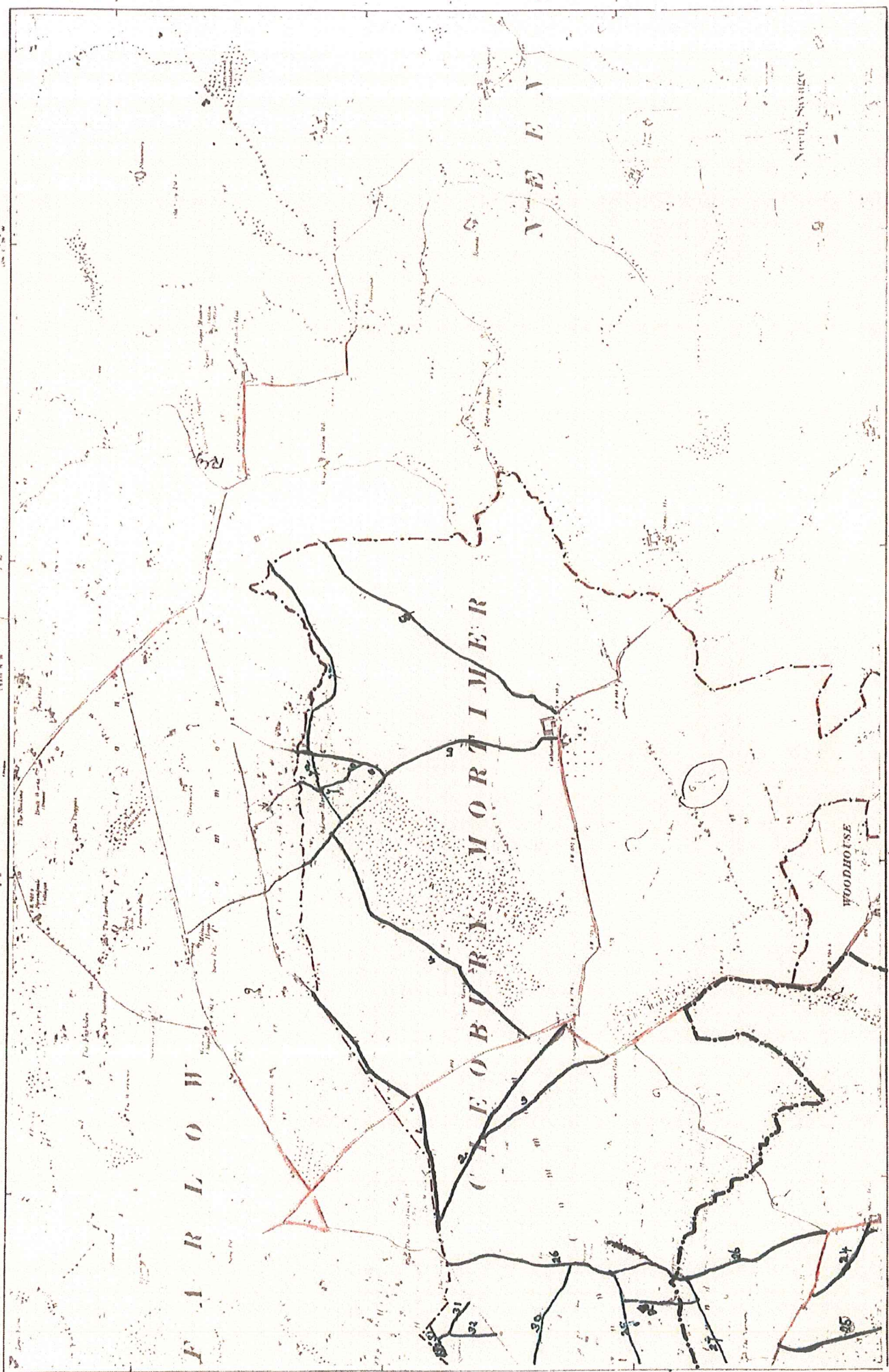

CLAIM OF PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY (footpath)  
Catherton to Woodhouse in Hopton Wafers

This route is shown clearly on the 1899 OS map and all subsequent maps. It is still visible on the current OS map although not as a ROW

The route is shown on the Finance Act map of 1910

The map used in the process of creating the definitive map, shows the route but no claim made against it. This is a copy provided from Shropshire Right of Way team. There are question marks on it to show that someone has queried why it is not a Right of Way.

It is a mystery as to why this path was not claimed. It clearly should have been.

There is a second path also between Catherton and Woodhouse shown on all these documents which should also have been claimed. This claim does not include that path. For the purposes of recreational walking, the one path is sufficient.
