NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION & COMING INTO OPERATION OF PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION AND DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT MODIFICATION ORDER HIGHWAYS ACT 1980 WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981

THE SHROPSHIRE COUNCIL (FOOTPATH 11Y (PART) PARISH OF OSWESTRY RURAL) PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2023

On 27th July 2023, The Shropshire Council (the "Council") confirmed the above named order made under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 and section 53A(2) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981.

The effect of the order as confirmed is to **divert** the full width of FP 11Y from Point A on the Order Map grid reference SJ 2490 2601 running in a general SSE then south-easterly direction, where it passes through an agricultural building, for approximately 67m. It then turns and runs in a general south-westerly direction through a pasture field, to meet a stile at Point B on the Order Map SJ 2486 2582. A total distance of approximately 215m **onto a line** from a pedestrian gate at Point A on the Order Map grid reference SJ 2490 2601 running in a general southerly direction along a natural grass surface for 59m. It then crosses a single sleeper bridge over a ditch and through a pedestrian gate grid reference SJ 2491 2595 and crosses a sealed surface private road to meet another pedestrian gate at grid reference SJ 2491 2595. From there it turns to run along the edge of a grass field, first in a general south-westerly direction for approximately 42m, then turning in a general southerly direction for approximately 106m to meet a pedestrian gate at Point B on the Order Map grid reference SJ 2486 2582. A total distance of approximately 222m and a width of 2m throughout.

Shropshire Council certify that the order becomes operative on 19th July 2023 but if a person aggrieved by the order wants to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the order, he or she may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 27th July 2023 make an application to the High Court.
