## Shropshire Council: Core Strategy Development Plan Document Adoption Statement

## Notice of adoption of the Core Strategy – February 2011

In accordance with Regulation 24(2) and Regulation 36 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Development) (England) Regulations 2004, notice is given that Shropshire Council formally adopted its Core Strategy Development Plan Document on **24 February 2011**.

The Core Strategy DPD covers the administrative County of Shropshire (excluding the Borough of Telford and Wrekin). It sets out the strategic planning policy for Shropshire, including a spatial vision and objectives. It also sets out a development strategy which identifies the level of development expected to take place within Shropshire up until 2026 and a number of Core Policies which will help to achieve the vision. All subsequent LDF documents produced will build upon the Core Strategy.

The Core Strategy has been subject to an Examination in Public by an independent Planning Inspector appointed by the Secretary of State. The adopted Core Strategy incorporates the binding recommendations set out in the Planning Inspector's report and accompanying appendices.

Any person aggrieved by the Core Strategy may make an application to the High Court under Section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 on the ground that:

- The document is not within the appropriate power;
- A procedural requirement has not been complied with.

An application must be made no later than the end of the period of six weeks from the date of the Core Strategy's adoption, which is **7 April 2011**.
